Parnpajinya Aboriginal Community Safety (PACS)	The Aboriginal Male's Healing Centre (AMHC) will occupy four donated BHP houses in East Newman and form the Parnpajinya Aboriginal Community Safety (PACS) project, a residential hub free from violence and alcohol. PACS will provide a mandatory residential healing and wellbeing space for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander men who use violence with the AMHC Clinical team providing family violence counselling. A Martu Wangkajarra Specialist Interpreter will be engaged to provide services in sociolinguist research, language dictionaries and general linguistic services.	\$25,000

RISE Program	Angelhands will implement the RISE program, an intensive workshop for women with experiences of family and domestic violence that promotes learning and new behaviours to reduce the likelihood of revictimisation by intimate partners going forward. City of Belmont	Social Street Basketball Program	The City of Belmont will implement the Social Street Basketball program which aims to promote basketball and engage proactively with at-risk youths by positively influencing their behaviour and attitudes and to discourage them from anti-social and criminal behaviour. Case management and support for at-risk youths will be available to participants through the YMCA Base at Belmont.	\$20,949
