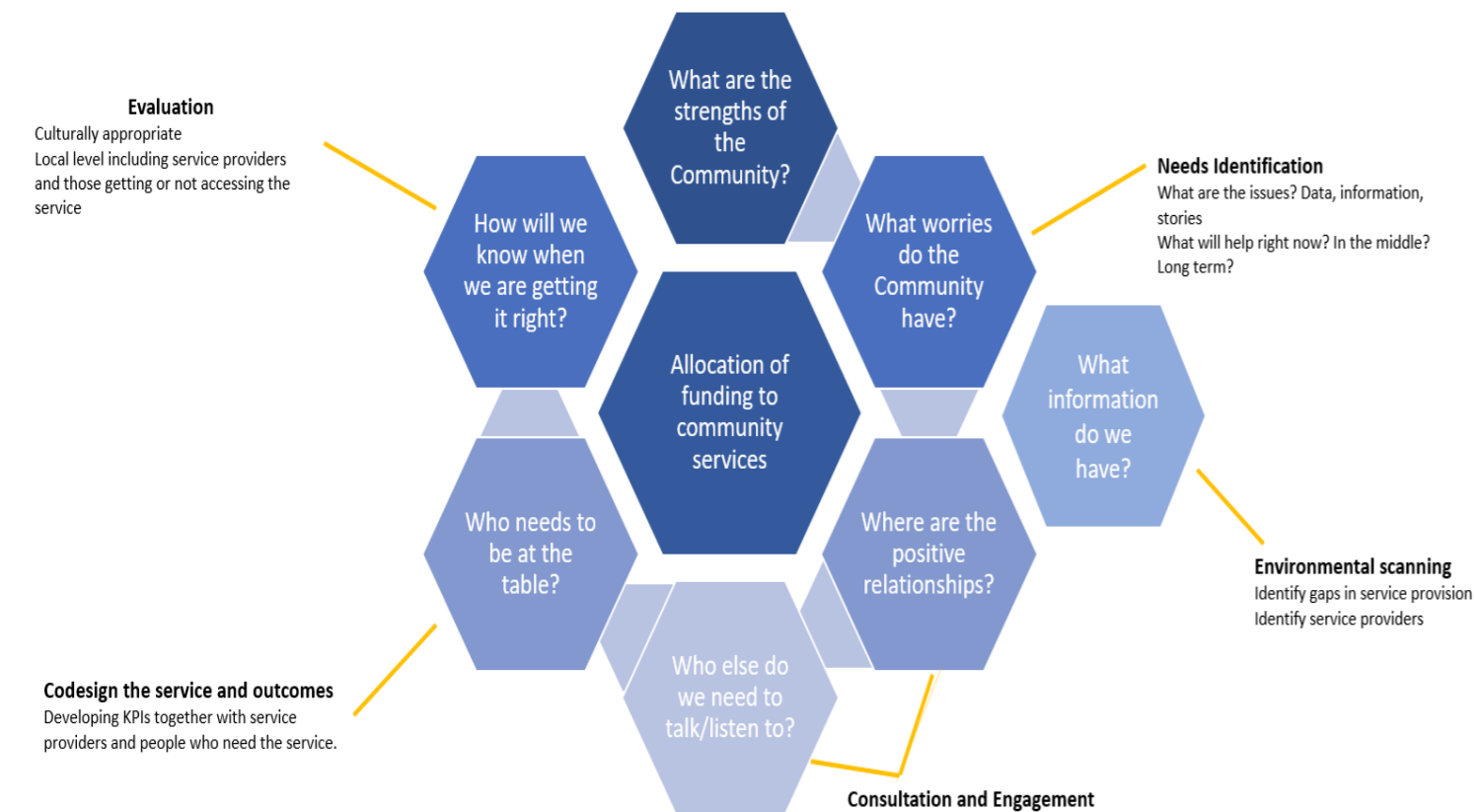
### OUTCOMES
