| <b>Town of Bassendean</b>                          | <b>Graffiti Reporting</b>                          | The Town of Bassendean will replace out-dated mobile devices currently used to record and report incidents of graffiti in the town with new Toughpads.   | <b>\$17,194</b>        |
| <b>City of Perth</b>                               | <b>Graffiti Reporting and Analysis</b>             | The City of Perth will purchase new software to improve graffiti data collection and analysis. Graffiti data collected will include a GPS location for each tag, leading to improved mapping and graphic representation to enable more accurate identification of graffiti hotspots.   | <b>\$20,000</b>        |
| <b>City of Gosnells</b>                            | <b>Graffiti Prevention Campaign</b>                | The City of Gosnells will work alongside young people to develop a graffiti prevention campaign to educate peers on the consequences for themselves and their community. The project will fuse art and education to raise awareness on the negative impacts of graffiti, including the negative impact of a criminal record on the ability to gain employment and travel overseas. Themes that come from the workshops will be used to inspire a series of posters designed by a prominent street artist which will be displayed at the City of Gosnells facilities, shopping centres, schools, skate parks and youth centres. | <b>\$20,000</b>        |
| <b>Town of Mosman Park</b>                         | <b>Graffiti Reporting Equipment Upgrade</b>        | The Town of Mosman Park will upgrade its current graffiti reporting software and mobile field device to allow for more accurate and effective reporting of graffiti incidents to WA Police.  | <b>\$12,565</b>        |
| <b>Australian Railway Historical Society of WA</b> | <b>Anti-graffiti Fencing at the Railway Museum</b> | The Australian Railway Historical Society of WA will install garrison fencing around areas of the Railway Museum in Bassendean that have been the target of forced entry and graffiti. This will reduce easy access and lower associated graffiti incidences.  | <b>\$20,000</b>        |
| <b>City of Rockingham</b>                          | <b>Graffiti Management Solution</b>                | The City of Rockingham will upgrade their current graffiti reporting technology including mobile devices and software technology. The updated technology has greater image capture capabilities and will result in improved data accuracy.   | <b>\$18,179</b>        |
| <b>Shire of Pingelly</b>                           | <b>Pioneer Park Toilets</b>                        | The Shire of Pingelly will install graffiti resistant doors and solar lighting to the public toilets located at Pioneer Park in Pingelly. Three remaining smooth surface toilet doors will be replaced with new custom mini-orb profile doors which use corrugation to make the surface unsuitable for scratching wording onto the doors. Vandal proof solar lighting will also be installed at the toilet block to deter antisocial behaviour at night time.  | <b>\$8,757</b>         |
| <b>Australian Railway Historical Society of WA</b> | <b>Graffiti Wipe Out at Railway Museum</b>         | The Australian Railway Historical Society of WA will paint over graffiti on historic railway vehicles, locomotives, carriages and wagons at the Railway Museum in Bassendean. A contractor will be engaged to supply paint and paint over 1260sq metres of graffiti on the surfaces of historic railway vehicles.  | <b>\$17,140</b>        |
