INFORMATION FOR APPLICANTS

WA Police can only spend a lesser conviction from a WA Court. A lesser conviction is defined as a penalty for which imprisonment for 12 months or less or a fine of \$15,000 or less was imposed.

A serious conviction is one for which the penalty exceeds those classified as a lesser conviction. Serious convictions can only be spent by the District Court who can be contacted for more information on 9425 2222.
