

WHY RECORD OUR PROPERTY?

PROPERTY RECORDING SERVES SEVERAL PURPOSES

- Property that is marked is less desirable to a burglar as it is harder for them to sell;
- If property is stolen and marked there is a greater chance of it being returned to the owner;
- If a burglar is arrested with property that is marked it is easier for police to get a conviction.

WHAT DO I RECORD?

Even if you think your property isn't valuable, you can still record it. If it is stolen, it makes it more difficult for the burglar to dispose of and far more likely that they will be convicted if caught in possession

Examples of property commonly recorded include; TVs, DVD players, paintings, MP3 players, Playstations, laptops, jewellery, sunglasses, GPS systems.

HOW DO I RECORD PROPERTY?

THERE ARE SEVERAL WAYS TO RECORD PROPERTY:

- Engraving;
- Photography;
- Micro dots (usually used for large objects such as cars and precious items such as jewellery, antiques or paintings);
- Ultra violet pens

Engravers can be purchased from hardware stores, or your local Crime Prevention Office or Neighbourhood Watch group may have engravers available to borrow.

It is recommended you engrave the property with your driver's licence number because this is a unique number which can easily be identified by police. Where you engrave the property is important. If you want the engraving to be out of sight, choose somewhere behind or underneath the item rather than somewhere hidden which the police would not be able to find it. If it is a mobile phone take the battery out and write underneath this on the phone itself. Larger items such as Plasma TV's and stereo systems can be engraved near the items serial number.

It is recommended you also take photos of your property and valuables, particularly items you may not want to engrave such as jewellery and paintings. If you take photos of yourself wearing the jewellery, it will help with insurance claims if the item is stolen.
